

Playwright - Sergei Davydov



Sergei Davydov is a Russian playwright, writer and poet and holds an MA in Philology (HSE University, Moscow). The author of over 30 plays presented at stages throughout the world. His plays, novels and poems have been translated into many languages, including English, Japanese, Spanish, Italian and others. In 2023 he left Russia. In the same year,

Freedom Letters published Sergei Davydov's novel "Springfield" about queer people in pre-war Russia. The novel became a bestseller in Russian and various critics called the book "Springfield" "one of the most important texts written in Russian in recent years.

Director - Ray Hanna

Ray Hanna is an Egyptian-American writer and director whose storytelling journey began at nine with short stories and evolved through school comedy sketches and youth theatrical productions. In college in Egypt, he founded a theatre company producing original political and social satires. After moving to the U.S. and a twenty-year hiatus to focus on career and



family, a chance encounter with John J. Pistone reignited his passion, leading him to direct "Baby with the Bath Water." In 2022, Ray established RimoVision, producing two original satires and aiming to rejuvenate audience interest in live theatre amidst economic challenges.

Actor - Misha Suvorov



Misha Suvorov is a trained actor from Saint Petersburg, Russia. Sanford Meisner Center 2016 graduate and RimoVision loyal group member since 2023, Misha works on stage, TV and in film. Most known for his roles in TV shows 'The Americans', 'Secret Space Escapes' and 'Chosen Ones', films 'Girls Lost', 'Five Stars' and 'Shadow

Wall', theatrical roles include 'Love's Labour Lost', 'The Gift of the Magi' and 'The Awkward Tale of Carrot and Those Who Art in Heaven'.

Russian America for Democracy in Russia (RADR),

a diaspora organization of pro-democracy Russians in the US (https://democracy4russia.org). RADR focuses on strengthening a pro-democracy Russian community in the United States, supporting the democratic movement, human and civil rights in Russia, and helping Ukraine win the brutal and criminal war by engaging Russian Americans in community development, educational outreach, fundraisings, and policy advocacy. In December 2023, Russian America for Democracy in Russia was designated as undesirable by Russian authorities. This status enables them to penalize Russian citizens who support, volunteer, or participate in our activities. RADR was formed in 2021 and now includes 18 communities of pro-Democracy and anti-war Russians in the US—from Boston to Miami on the East Coast and from Seattle to San Diego on the West Coast. RADR is a part of a global network of Russian pro-democracy and anti-war organizations across the globe.

RADR has a number of programs that support its mission, including:

- Community events, networking
- Research Projects: "Real Estate" and "Agents"—This involves searching for real estate properties owned by Putin's oligarchs, officials, associates, and agents in the USA, as well as investigating the activities of pro-Kremlin organizations and agents of influence in the USA.
- Freedom Birds for Ukraine—Fundraising efforts to support Ukraine, including humanitarian assistance for civilians and aid for the Ukrainian military and Russian volunteers in the Ukrainian army. More information can be found at www.freedombirds.help.
- Advocacy—Engaging with the US Congress, the State Department, and the White House through meetings, information dissemination, and petitions.
- Adaptation—Providing chats for new immigrants to share advice on everyday life and immigration issues, along with offering educational and informational courses.
- "Anti-Propaganda"—Disseminating facts about the war and its consequences on Russian social networks.

The Border – a Russian anti-war self-confession

Los Angeles, California-An important event for the theater community is on the horizon: the premiere of the play 'The Border' by Russian playwright Sergei Davydov (Springfield, Kolya against all, Republic, No one wanted to die and others) at the Hollywood Fringe Festival, to be held at The Actors Company. The one-person show will be presented by the non-profit theater company RimoVision Group, starring Misha Suvorov and is a part of 'Theatre against the war' movement. 'The Border' is a dramatic poem crafted using the auto fictional method. The plot unfolds during the full-scale Russian invasion of Ukraine. The main character, a young man from Moscow, opposes the war. To avoid becoming a victim of repression, he is forced to leave the country. However, his plans are shattered when he learns that his mother, who lives in a war zone on the border of two countries, is surviving a heart attack. Amidst the bombings, the characters are forced to find ways of reconciliation and forgiveness during war and dictatorship. The premiere of 'The Border' at the Hollywood Fringe Festival promises to be a powerful theatrical event, captivating audiences with its relevance and depth of theme.
